Learning System and Methodology / Contingency Plan

- Lectures/participatory classes (4 sessions in face-to-face format) in which the theoretical contents of the programme will be described and the core issues of the syllabus may be discussed.
- Working group exposition (classroom format).
- Search, consultation and processing of information (online format).
- Exercises (online format)

The virtual parts will focus, preferably, on the development of written competence (reading and writing) and, in some cases, listening, as they require less interaction with the rest of the students. The face-to-face parts of the course will be dedicated, especially, to the contents that allow the development of oral skills, especially speaking and interaction (talking).

COMPETENCY ASSESSMENT

Criteria and Assessment Tools / Contingency Plan

The assessment of the course will combine the principles of continuous assessment and final exam and will be carried out depending on the assessment call (ordinary or extraordinary).

Ordinary assessment call:

- 70% Submission of written work and/or oral presentation (face-to-face).
- 30% Completion of activities and submission of assignments through the Virtual Classroom (Blackboard).

Extraordinary assessment call:

- 100% Submission of written work and/or oral presentation (face-to-face).

Plagiarism penalization- According to what is established in Chapter 1.4.4 of the "Regulations for the evaluation of student learning at the University of Almeria", the practice of plagiarism of work done by other students, as well as bibliography and web pages will be penalized. The detection of deliberate plagiarism may result in a failing grade in the call to which the student is submitted.
