Contents of the course:

- 1: Introduction to cultural studies and gender studies.
- 2: Feminist literary criticism: Katherine Mansfield's "Miss Brill".
- 3: Literature and gender: A Room of One's Own by Virginia Woolf.
- 4: Feminine identity in autobiographical narrative: Notes to Self by Emilie Pine.
- 5: Gender and humour: "The Portable Virgin" by Ann Enright.

Learning System and Methodology

Learning activities in class: master class, text analysis, handling of research literature, writing essays, oral presentations, powerpoint presentations, documentaries, debates, etc.

Student autonomous work: students are expected to read the materials offered to them in order to learn the contexts of each topic more efficiently. They are also expected to be able to analyse compulsory readings from a given critical perspective.

Blended learning: 25 % online (Blackboard platform) + 75% in the classroom.
