

PGM 2022: Author Instructions for Camera-Ready Papers

Abstract

The abstract is a mandatory element that should summarize the contents of the paper. It should be confined within a single paragraph.

Keywords: We would like to encourage you to list your keywords here. They should be separated by semicolons and the last is followed by a full stop.

1. Major Guidelines

Your PGM 2022 abstract and paper should be submitted via the PGM 2022 Easychair page (link accessible from the conference’s home page). The abstract and paper deadlines are June 3 2022 and June 10 2022, respectively. Limit your text, bibliography and appendices included, to 12 pages.

In case of acceptance, the camera-ready version of your PGM 2022 paper should be submitted via the PGM 2022 Easychair page by September 5, 2022. Please consider the following guidelines during the preparation.

- Again, limit your text, bibliography and appendices included, to 12 pages.
- Following the JMLR naming conventions, assign to your paper the following (lower-case) ID: surname of the first author followed by two-digit year of publication and iterative letter code. E.g., the ID of the first paper by John Doe should be `doe18a`.
- If the paper is accepted then download the Publication Agreement. Print, fill, and sign the form. The name of the PDF scan should be the ID with the suffix “Permission” (e.g., `doe18aPermission.pdf`). This file should be included in the folder with the sources to be uploaded on Easychair.
- Your paper should be typeset using \LaTeX . Put all the files required for the compilation (sources, images, etc.) in a folder. Use the ID for the folder name and for the main \LaTeX file (e.g., `doe18a.tex`). Compress the folder in a zip or a tarball archive before uploading it on Easychair. Do not forget to attach the signed Publication Agreement form.

2. Some Other Guidelines

- The title of the paper and of the sections should capitalize on the first letter of each word, except for articles, conjunctions, and prepositions. If possible, try to avoid `\subsubsection`.

- Ensure that below each figure and table there is a caption (e.g., see Table 1).
- Acknowledgements should go at the end, before appendices and references.
- For UTF8 encoding (e.g., to quickly write *astéroïde* in your paper), add to the preamble:

\inputencoding{utf8}
```

- Please do not change the size of the fonts, the line spacing, and the margins.
- To cite, use `\citep{}`, or `\cite{}` command - e.g. (Einstein, 1905), or Goossens et al. (1993).
